## Executive Director & Presidents' Report



This is a very exciting time for Langley Hospice as we enter into our **30<sup>th</sup> anniversary year** of providing compassionate support to help people live with dignity and hope while coping with grief and the end of life. It seems prudent during this anniversary year to present an extended Annual General Meeting Report which includes the history of Langley Hospice and an update of the progress made toward our Strategic Planning Priorities 2012-2015.

We have another important date to celebrate. This year marks the **15<sup>th</sup> anniversary** of Second Story Treasures Thrift Store. Since the actual date is September 17, 1998, stay tuned for upcoming celebrations in the fall. The Hospice Thrift Store continues to be a strong and dependable source of revenue for Langley Hospice. It is amazing to note that **70** volunteers contributed **17,187** hours over the past year to ensure that merchandise is sorted, steamed/washed, and displayed creatively on the store shelves. The Spring Fling "Turn-over" day on March 30 resulted in record daily sales of **\$5,121.75**. Due to the dedication of the community, including volunteers, donors and customers, our sales keep increasing – this year the store sales are up by **8%** which is a

remarkable achievement.

Additionally, we are very proud of our ability to support over **300** bereaved children and youth in schools, at our Supportive Program Centre, through day activity camps and our 4-day Camp

Chrysalis retreat. Educational presentations, such as the *Cycle of Life* in elementary schools and *Hospice Bereavement Awareness for Planning Ten* classes in secondary schools, have reached **458** students. Since our philosophy is to support the family as the unit of care, we have developed a 2-hour education session entitled "Supporting Grieving Children/Youth" which is offered to the parents of the bereaved children we support.

Two new bereavement programs were implemented, *Well-being Yoga* and *Heart 2 Heart* widows group, both facilitated by trained volunteers. The total number of bereavement clients served in the last year was **675**, with **2,200** contact hours. Two memorial events were held during the year; Journey through the Holidays and a Spring Memorial, attended by over **90** people.

We continue to support the Langley Hospice Residence with **52** volunteers contributing **5,038** hours in 2012/13, doing shifts at the Hospice Residence from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm.

This past year, the Society board of directors has welcomed three new directors: Elaine Walton, Alma Barranco-Mendoza and Bob Carpenter. However, the board is saddened to say farewell to Lawrence Eta, who has completed his term of three years and due to business commitments is unable to continue. In anticipation of our renewed vision of a permanent hospice residence, the Board of Directors has established a committee dedicated to moving forward with this initiative. It has come to our attention that Fraser Health and the Langley Memorial Hospital Foundation (LMHF) will be starting a high-level "Site Master Concept Planning" process for the hospital grounds. Once the process is complete, the LMHF Board of Directors will use the results to determine priority projects for the short, mid and long term. Langley Hospice will continue its advocacy role and be involved in this process to emphasize the importance of establishing a permanent hospice residence.

The work we do could not be sustained without the dedication of our **157** volunteers who contributed **26,708** hours in the past year, which is equivalent to **13** people working full-time! Our volunteer activities include the Foundation and Society boards, hospice thrift store, office/administration, special events, visiting palliative and/or bereavement clients, children's program and the quilting group. Thanks to each and every one of you for a productive and successful year!

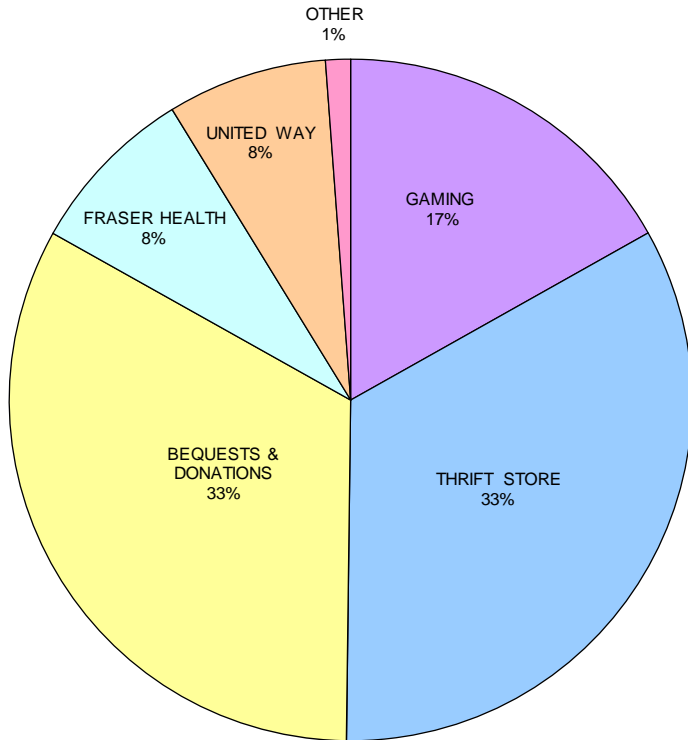

# LANGLEY HOSPICE SOCIETY REVENUE/EXPENSES 2012/13

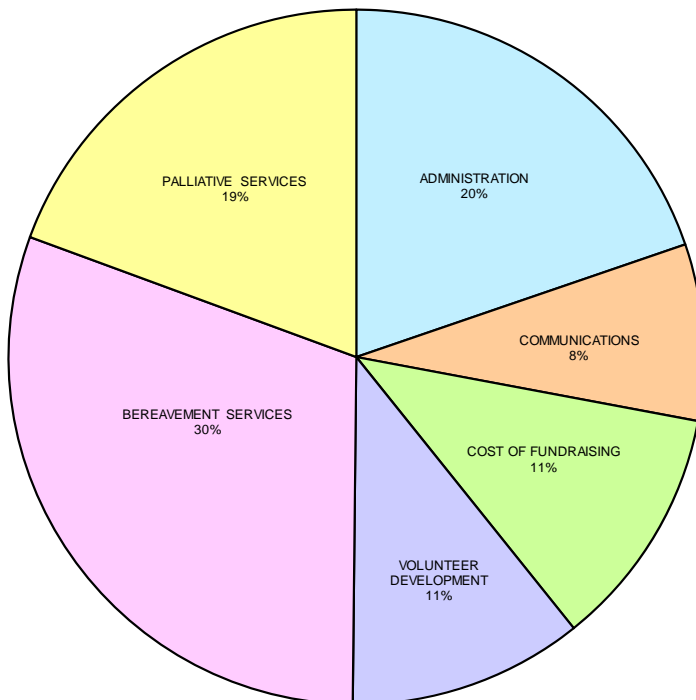
## Revenue

## History of Langley Hospice

### ➤ Celebrating 30 Years of Service to Our Community ➤

*This October, the Langley Hospice Society (LHS) celebrates its 30<sup>th</sup> year anniversary of dedicated service in hospice palliative care to the citizens of Langley and the surrounding Township.*

*So, how did this 30 year journey begin? Well, much like many dreams it all began around a kitchen table. To be specific it was Jeannine McCarthy's kitchen table and the year was 1980. Previous to that, as a young adult Jeannine experienced the death of her mother. Being a nurse herself, she struggled with the lack of support and services available to her and her family during this difficult time. Through her nursing experience and her own personal loss, she knew that there was a need to provide better care for dying and bereaved people. So after seeking out and receiving hospice palliative care training from Denis Boyd, psychologist and counsellor, the grassroots hospice movement began. Jeannine recruited several colleagues and friends and formed the "hospice committee". Dorscie Paterson, also a founding member, was part of that committee and she recalls their first donation: "The Kinettes gave us fifty bucks for stamps to send out letters inviting people to attend a public meeting. We wanted to promote the hospice dream and garner support from the community." The committee worked diligently over the next three years gathering the support of key stakeholders, community members and the medical community resulting in the incorporation of the Langley Hospice Society on October 19, 1983.*

*Over the next couple of years, there was a flurry of activity, with LHS moving into its first official office space in the long term care office building on Fraser Highway, across from the hospital. This provided greater exposure to the community and other organizations. In 1991, the first palliative care room was designated at the Langley Memorial Hospital and decorated in a "home-like" atmosphere through the efforts of LHS.*

*On August 19, 1994 the Langley Hospice Foundation (LHF) was registered under the Societies Act. Its mandate was to raise funds to support the operations of the Society, i.e. delivery of hospice palliative care programs and services.*

*On February 9, 1998, Langley Hospice purchased and moved into their first "Hospice House" at 20088 – 40A Avenue in Brookwood. The funds used to purchase the house were raised through garage sales, golf tournaments, concerts, community donations and a lottery. Despite the arduous fundraising efforts, it was still necessary to have a mortgage. The house played many roles over the years, serving as a facility for bereavement support groups, hospice training sessions, volunteer support, Society and Foundation board meetings, numerous workshops, a lending library and a place for the community to feel at home. Later that same year, Second Story Treasures Thrift Store opened in Walnut Grove. This was, indeed, a community effort and the motto of "reduce, reuse, recycle and rethink" was adopted. Over the years the hospice thrift store provided an important and secure source of revenue for the Society.*



*In the year 2000, Langley Health Services received approval for a hospice palliative care doctor and Dr. Adamson was hired and given the task of developing a formal Hospice Palliative Care Program and acting as a consultant for other physicians, nurses, pharmacists and families. This was a crucial step in recognizing the importance of end-of-life care in our community.*

*In 2004 Fraser Health announced the opening of 10 hospice beds in partnership with the Langley Hospice Society. The interim 10-bed hospice residence is housed in one wing of Maple Hill Extended Care Facility on the Langley Memorial Hospital grounds. Fraser Health committed to funding the renovations, essential medical equipment and operating funds. The Langley Hospice Society committed to providing the funding to fully furnish the rooms to create a home-like atmosphere. In June of 2005, the Langley Hospice Residence accepted their first palliative patients. As well as being a safe haven for patients and their families, it also serves as a place of various celebrations. The palliative team joined in celebrating the first and only marriage by toasting the wonderful couple with champagne. On*

*another occasion a hospice room was decorated with Canadian flags, banners and streamers, as the patient and his loved ones celebrated his Canadian citizenship. The devoted staff arranged for the appropriate Immigration officials to be present to make it legal. Other celebrations include carol singing at Christmas, ongoing "high tea" service, and various musicians performing, all for the enjoyment of the patients and their loved ones.*

*In January of 2005, Second Story Treasures Thrift store acquired the adjacent bay and renovations were completed, resulting in doubling the square footage. Square footage plays a significant role in the amount of sales because there is room for more donated merchandise. It is interesting to note that the gross sales also doubled in a period of a few short years.*

*A special Mortgage Retirement Ceremony was held on April 22, 2006 to celebrate making the final payment on the Hospice Society's "house" at 20088 – 40A Avenue – a big fiscal milestone for the Society.*

*With generous funding from the Vancouver Foundation, Langley Hospice's 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Camp Chrysalis for twenty-two grieving children and teens was successfully implemented in August of 2006. This incredible four day camp continues to be held in August of every year and is attended by grieving children/teens from Langley and surrounding communities.*

*On September 25, 2009 Langley Hospice purchased a beautiful property situated on a half-acre at 20660 – 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue in the City of Langley. It took seven months of negotiations with the City of Langley to rezone the property which allowed Langley Hospice to deliver their administrative and supportive programs to the community. On May 19, 2010 Langley Hospice finally moved to their new location. The **Langley Hospice Supportive Program Centre** continues to serve the City and Township of Langley. Last year alone, over 4,500 people visited or called the Centre for support. We strive to sustain our current core bereavement programs for children, adults and teens and our palliative client volunteer program. We have also developed new and innovative programs to meet the needs of the community. These include a Heart 2 Heart widows group and Well-being Yoga for the bereaved.*



*For 30 years, we have built upon the foundations of visionary leaders and have partnered with Fraser Health to deliver excellent hospice palliative care in the communities of Langley. Now as we look to the future, our vision is even stronger and focused on ensuring that we have the resources to meet the ever-growing hospice palliative care needs of our community. It is imperative that the Langley Hospice Society move forward in our strategic goal of building a permanent, fully functional Hospice Residence that is up to the high standards of other Hospice Residences. We are in the process of identifying key stakeholders, including discussions with the Langley Memorial Hospital Foundation and Fraser Health in order to move forward with the process. As we rise to the challenges of running a not-for-profit organization in this day and age, we must remember where we come from, and remember where we are going. The future is bright!*
